Overview

The Codebook was designed by Prajjwal Prajjwal (Glasgow). Responsibility for errors rests with the Principal Investigators.

This is a project to study the foreign policy attitudes of Britons, with the specific aim of comparing attitudes in Scotland and England. Respondents were recruited using the Momentive/SurveyMonkey endpage recruitment methodology between October 3 and October 22, 20221. As a key aim of the project was to compare Scottish and English respondents, oversampling Scottish respondents was necessary.

To achieve this aim, two parallel online surveys were fielded: 1) in the entire United Kingdom; 2) in Scotland. The content of both surveys was the same. The raw samples are not representative of the target populations, necessitating weights to be used. Three weighting variables are available: 1) "weight" which weights the respondent to demographics representative of the UK population; 2) "weight_eng" which weights English respondents to demographics representative of the English population; and 3) "weight_sct" which weights Scottish respondents to demographics representative of the Scottish population.

For convenience, the finaldataset contains "weight_eng_sct" that creates weights in a single variable for English and Scottish respondents. Respondents from Wales and Northern Ireland were too few, resulting in large Modelled Error Estimates. Thus, we excluded these respondents from the final data release. The baseline for the weights were demographic data from the census and the Annual Population Survey (ONS/NRS/NISRA). The Modelled Error estimate for the combined English and Scottish sample is 2%, for England only 2.5%, and for Scotland 3%. The variable names are as they appear in the dataset.
